Interview: Petra Storrs

Usually I'm loathe to talk in breathy, hero-worship tones but let's make no bones about it, I absolutely gawked when I first encountered the work of art director Petra Storrs - she's a set, prop and costume designer who has worked some serious origami-fashion magic with lots of bits of paper, amongst other things. Having been recently featured in Dazed and Confused, Storrs has been dressing a series of super brilliant muso-types like MGMT, Telepathe and Paloma Faith, for the latter constructed a ruddy brilliant umbrella dress out of mirrors.



Her work with paper and other inexpensive materials is testament to the potential for creativity to flourish even when times are hard. Practically speaking you'd be wise to stay away from water, flames and people with scissors, but these are minor quibbles, all that matters is that you'd look pretty damn cool.

Tell me a bit about your DIY ethos - when did you start experimenting? Well, I design and make things, so I-do-it-myself, and I think it's important the

designing and making processes go together as they inform each other. I have been working professionally as an art director and designer for a couple of years now, but previous to that I have always been very busy making art and my mum taught me and my friend to sew when we where very young (maybe 4 or 5 years old), and all our next door neighbours where painters, sculptors or keen quilt makers so I have always found it very appealing. Do you think we're going to be seeing a lot more of it? Is creativity changing?

I don't know, it is hard to have an overview when you're in this little bubble! I think its

important to try to work in a way that means you get the most creative output from what you put in be it time, materials or money. East London is choc a block with talented creative people working away for next to nothing, I think they should all be paid lots of money, that would be a nice change!

I would like people to be pleased and for them to remember it, but my primary motivation is really for me, its like art therapy!
